Across East Lothian, there are a wide range of health, medical and care services that can be accessed by getting in touch with the most appropriate health professionals first time around.

Your GP Practice does not need to be your first point of contact. You can **GO DIRECT** to a number of Primary Care services.

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NHS Inform

NHS Inform is the national health information service for Scotland. It is an online portal that offers a wide range of health advice and resources to help individuals make informed decisions.



What advice can be found?

NHS Inform provides information that is reviewed by healthcare professionals to ensure accuracy and reliability on a wide range of topics such as:

- illnesses, injuries and conditions
- tests and treatments
- self-care
- mental health
- sexual health
- healthy living topics – such as smoking, alcohol and drug use and food nutrition.

NHS 24

You can access NHS 24 by calling 111.

This service provides urgent care triage if you think you need A&E but it is not life threatening. NHS 24 will also give you advice when your GP Practice, pharmacy or dental practice is closed.



*You should phone **999** or go straight to A&E for life or limb-threatening emergencies.*

This might include:

- suspected heart attack or stroke
- severe breathing difficulties
- severe bleeding
- severe injury

Pharmacy First

Your local pharmacy can provide you with expert help for treating conditions such as sore throats, earache and cold sores, along with common clinical conditions such as urinary tract infections (UTIs).



Pharmacy First

Under the Pharmacy First Scheme, you can (after consultation with a pharmacist) get prescription medication free of charge for various minor ailments, including:

- antibiotics for UTIs (aged 18-65 meeting certain criteria - women only)
- acne, allergies, athlete's foot
- backache, blocked nose
- constipation, cold sores, cough, cystitis (in women)
- headache, hayfever, headlice, haemorrhoids (piles)
- shingles and skin infections
- diarrhoea
- earache, eczema
- impetigo, indigestion
- mouth ulcers
- sore throat
- pain, period pain
- threadworms, thrush
- warts
- verrucas

Pharmacists, like GPs, can only provide certain medicines and products on the NHS.

If you want a specific medicine or product, you may need to buy it.

If the pharmacist, or a member of their team, thinks it is better for you to see your GP or another healthcare professional, they may refer you directly or tell you to make an appointment.

Musculoskeletal

The musculoskeletal physiotherapy service can help support, diagnose and provide treatment for those suffering with muscle, joint or back pain.



What is Musculoskeletal (MSK) Physiotherapy?

Musculoskeletal conditions are those which affect the bones, muscles, tendons and joints - such as back pain, sports injuries, arthritis, sprains and strains.

MSK Physiotherapy Services help support people with their problems through education, advice, movement, exercise and physiotherapy.

We are open to all East Lothian residents aged 16 or over.

You will see or speak to a physiotherapist directly within 48 hours of contacting our service who will be able to assess and help you over the phone, before making a plan for any ongoing management needed. Face - to - face appointments are offered at:

Mental Health Service

There is now a quicker way to access a wide range of Mental Health specialists in East Lothian.



Mental Health Team

CWIC Mental Health is a primary care service for people in East Lothian aged over 17 years and 9 months. The team includes mental health occupational therapists, mental health nurses and primary care administrators, who are based at **East Lothian Community Hospital, Haddington.**

The team works closely with GP Practices, Adult Mental Health services and local third sector services to help you get the right support for your needs.

What we do

- We will listen to you, and come up with plans to manage ongoing mental health issues by offering a compassionate approach, specialist skills and an understanding of how past experiences can impact how we feel now.
- We can liaise with GPs about medication options if necessary.

- We can help prevent mental illness from escalating and promote mental wellbeing and hope for the future.
- We help you to set goals and reach your potential in all activities including work and college.
- We refer and signpost to other services such as community projects and other NHS services such as Psychological Therapies, Community Mental Health Team and Psychiatry.

What happens when you phone?

Our business support team will ask you for some brief details about yourself.

They will then book you an appointment with a mental health specialist.

Appointments may be:

- by phone
- by video consultation
- face to face

Our appointments are 30 minutes long.

Dental Care

For any and all dental issues, please contact your registered dentist in the first instance.



Registered Patients

If you have a dental problem, you should call the dental practice that you normally attend in the first instance to discuss any treatment needs.

If you have registered with a practice since June 2006 and have been seen for treatment, you will still be registered there (unless you have been notified otherwise).

Outside normal working hours, if you feel you have an urgent dental need, please contact NHS 24 on 111.



Unregistered Patients

Unregistered patients requiring urgent dental care should refer to the Emergency Dental Care page.

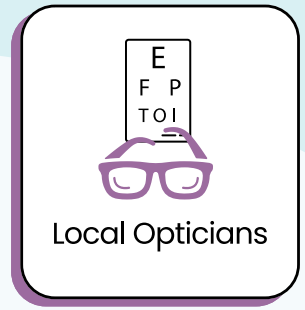

Do not visit a dental surgery without an appointment. If you wish to find out if you can access urgent or routine treatment at your nearest dental practice you should telephone the dental practice in advance.

Eye Care

For any and all issues affecting your eyes or eyesight, please contact your usual optician in the first instance.

Opticians will offer you a triage consultation to assess the urgency of your condition and arrange an appointment accordingly.



Opticians can also refer you to eye specialists if needed and make recommendations on treatments. Some can prescribe medication. If you have an urgent eye problem out with normal working hours than cannot wait until an optician opens,

you should phone NHS 24 on **111**.

Free Eye Tests

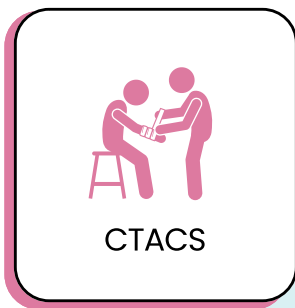
If you are a UK resident, you can get free NHS eye examination in Scotland.

This is not just to test your sight, it's a thorough examination to:

- check the health of your eyes
- find any eye problems before they become more serious
- look for signs of other health problems.

Community Treatment & Care Service (CTACS)

CTACS is a nurse led service providing services to patients across East Lothian.



Patients can contact us directly for:

- removal of sutures / staples after operations or injuries
- wound care – all wounds including post-operative, acute and chronic and acute (following an initial assessment by Minor Injuries or GP).

You may be referred to CTACS via your GP or Practice Nurse for

- vitamin B12 injections
- haematology bloods or pre-chemotherapy bloods (Secondary Care Consultant may direct you)
- doppler assessment (measurement of circulation in legs – once a GP or Nurse has referred you the team will contact you directly to arrange an appointment.)

Minor Injuries



If you have suffered an injury within the last 7 days that requires medical attention you can request an appointment with minor injuries specialists.

GP Minor Injuries Service

Some East Lothian Medical Practices can assess and treat minor injuries within Practice hours. **Please check with your Practice to confirm if this service is available.**

Minor Injuries Units

There are three dedicated Minor Injury Units covering the Lothians area at The Edinburgh Royal Infirmary, Western General Hospital and St John's, Livingston.

If your GP Practice does not offer a minor injuries service, or if you require treatment out-of-hours, contact 111 to request an appointment at a Minor Injuries Unit.

Minor Injuries Unit Teams can help adults and children over 12 months, who have had a recent minor injury of up to 7 days including:

- strains and sprains
- simple eye injuries
- wounds and minor burns
- insect bites and stings.
- minor bumps to head and face

An Emergency Nurse Practitioner or Physiotherapist will assess your injury and provide advice and treatment options.

Many minor injuries can be treated from the comfort of your own home, or with the help of a local pharmacy.

Depending on the nature of your injury, you may be offered a face-to-face appointment or in some cases you may be offered a video call.

Care When it Counts (CWIC)

After contacting your Medical Practice, you may find that you are offered a same day appointment with the 'Care When It Counts' team, (CWIC).



Requesting an appointment with the CWIC team

Access to the CWIC team is by referral via the GP surgeries that are currently linked to this service.

These surgeries are:

- Riverside Medical Practice, Musselburgh
- Inveresk Medical Practice, Musselburgh
- Tranent Medical Practice, Tranent
- The Harbours Medical Practice, Cockenzie

Contact your local Medical Practice, inform the Patient Advisory Team of the nature of your enquiry and they will confirm whether your concern can be handled by the CWIC team.

Will I receive a phone call or an in person appointment with the CWIC team?

You will likely receive an initial assessment over the phone, and if needed the CWIC team will offer you a face-to-face appointment. They'll agree an appropriate action plan with you, which might include a prescription, referral to hospital, other secondary care or arranging further tests.

- **Multi-disciplinary team**

The CWIC team includes a range of practitioners, including Nurse Practitioners, Advanced Nurse Practitioners, Physician Associates and GPs meaning you will be seen by the most appropriate medical professional in line with your enquiry.

- **Same-day care service**

Your needs will be dealt with by an appropriate medical professional on the same day that you request an appointment.

- **Speedy assessments and referrals**

The CWIC team are qualified to assess health needs and determine plans for care through autonomous decision making, care planning, care management and instigating any appropriate investigations or referrals to secondary care. Meaning you can either be provided with a prescription, support or advice, or indeed be referred to more specialist teams depending on the nature of your condition.

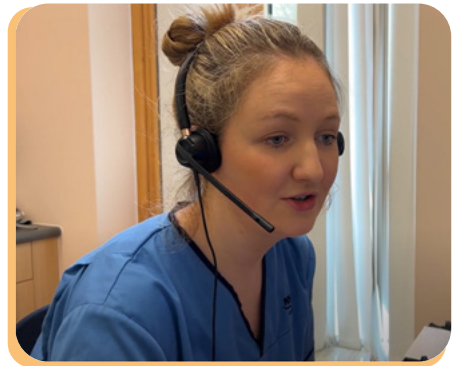

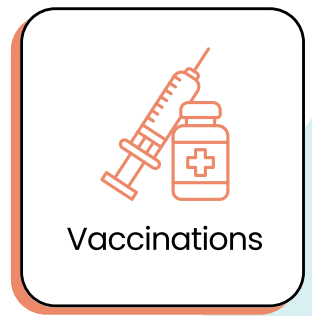

Vaccinations

The role of the Vaccination Teams in East Lothian is to provide a range of health protection services to residents across the county.



Primary Care Vaccination Team (Age 5+)

The Primary Care Vaccination Team manage all community based vaccinations out with school settings from age 5+.

This includes:

- covid vaccinations and boosters
- flu inoculations
- shingles and pneumococcal vaccines
- vaccinations recommended by GPs or Consultants due to specific health need

The team operate from a number of venues across the county including:

- Musselburgh Primary Care Centre
- Edington Hospital, North Berwick
- East Lothian Community Hospital

In addition, the team provide vaccinations across a number of settings including:

- care homes
- outreach – with our Vaccination Bus visiting a number of areas across the county
- in people's own homes, for individuals who are unable to attend vaccination centres

East Lothian Childhood Immunisation Team (0-5 years)

The East Lothian Childhood Immunisation Team (ELCIT) focus on delivering vaccinations for 0 - 5 years.

Rehabilitation Service

The East Lothian Rehabilitation Service (ELRS) is comprised of Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists, Exercise Specialists and Technology Enabled Care Services (TEC).



Occupational Therapy

Occupational therapists help people of all ages overcome challenges completing everyday tasks or activities.

Occupational therapists see beyond diagnoses and limitations to hopes and aspirations. They look at relationships between the activities you do every day alongside the challenges you face and your environment.

Physiotherapy

Physiotherapists help people affected by injury, illness or disability through movement and exercise, manual therapy, education and advice.

They maintain health for people of all ages, helping patients to manage pain and prevent disease.

They help to encourage development and facilitate recovery, enabling people to stay in work while helping them remain independent for as long as possible.

Technology Enabled Care

TEC is the use of different technologies to improve a person's outcomes. The 2 main types of technology covered by the TEC team are Telecare and Smart TEC.

Telecare

- We provide and install a range of equipment which can help you to live safely and independently at home
- Monitored 24hrs a day by our experienced alarm centre staff who will ensure the right response is arranged
- We assess your needs to determine the most suitable equipment for you and your environment.

Smart TEC

- Smart technology is readily available on the high street or online
- Devices are usually low cost and easy to set up
- Use Smart TEC to control your items in the home in a different way such as heating, lighting, security.

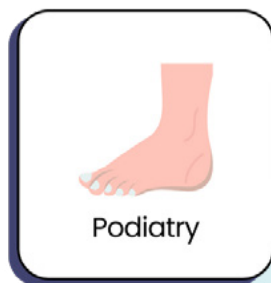
The East Lothian Rehabilitation Service have a dedicated website, abetterlife.eastlothian.gov.uk providing self-guided solutions and professional advice to support you to stay active and independent for as long as possible, enabling you to take charge of your own health and well-being.

Specific features of the website include an Interactive Smart Home, Interactive Body Map, Falls Prevention Advice and the opportunity to complete a Lifecurve™ assessment, a quiz which provides insights into how someone is ageing. The results of the quiz will help to signpost you to products, services and activities that will help you either maintain, or even recover some of your current abilities.

Podiatry

To access our service please complete our self-referral form. If you have a condition listed in the emergency or urgent section you will receive a phone call or letter with an appointment. If your referral is routine we will let you know you have been added to the waiting list. Scan QR code or search NHS Lothian Podiatry for self referral form.



Emergency - We aim to see you within 2 days

If you have exposed tissue or complications due to diabetes it is important you get help as soon as possible.

We will be able to issue an appointment if you suffer from the following:

- **Ulceration on your foot** - this is when the tissue is exposed. Call 999 if you showing signs of a fever or sepsis
- **Charcot Foot** - this is a serious complication of diabetes that develops if you have nerve damage and may have:
 - a red, hot, swollen toe or foot
 - a new break of wound in the skin
 - new redness or discolouration of your toe or foot
 - new or unexplained pain in your foot.

Urgent Conditions - We will aim to see you within 8 weeks

If your condition is having a serious impact on your day to day activities we will try to see you as quickly as possible.

- Have ingrown nails (please let us know if you are taking medication for this)

- Have curved nails with infection
- Have Diabetes and have a foot risk category of moderate, high risk or in remission
- Are in the armed forces or a veteran
- Are unable to carry out your day to day responsibilities at work or study or as a carer due to a prior condition.

Non Urgent Conditions - We aim to see you within 12 weeks

If your condition is causing you pain or discomfort but isn't stopping you doing your day to day activities we will book you in for a routine appointment.

We will provide an assessment for routine foot care such as a painful nail, corn or callous if you have a medical diagnosis of:

- peripheral arterial disease
- neuropathy
- rheumatoid Arthritis
- neurological disorders (e.g. Multiple Sclerosis, Parkinson's disease, Stroke)
- cancer – and are undergoing chemotherapy
- foot/ leg amputation
- chronic Kidney Disease stage 4 or 5
- a condition that suppresses your immune system
- diabetes, if you have a risk category of moderate/high risk/in remission we will aim to see you within 8 weeks.

What we don't see (please see a pharmacist)

- basic personal foot care and nail cutting
- thickened or misshapen nails
- fungal nail infections
- athlete's foot
- callous and corns
- flat feet without pain
- verrucae
- braces, splints, callipers or footwear.
